Materials Needed:

- Paper plate
 - Paint or Markers
 - Black and yellow paper
 - Scissors
 - Glue
1. Start by painting or coloring rainbow stripes on the front of a paper plate.
 2. Flip over and paint or color the back of the plate as well. If using paint, wait for the paint on the front to dry.
 3. Grab the scissors and start at the outside of the plate to cut spirals.
 4. Cut out a black pot of gold and glue it to the end of the plate.
 5. Glue on some yellow circles to the pot to make the gold.
 6. Poke a hole in the middle of the plate to put a string through so you can hang it up.
